This ATI Scholarship Program encourages capable and deserving children of farmers and fisherfolks with annual gross income not exceeding to 100,000, to pursue studies and professional career advancement in

agriculture and fisheries. It also provides subsidy for their continuous education to produce new breed of farmers who possess desirable knowledge, skills and attitudes in creating agribusiness initiatives.

Under the said scholarship program, the grantee is entitled to school fees/ registration fees per semester, testing fees, monthly stipend of 5,000.00, book allowance of 1,500 per semester, lodging allowance in the amount of 1,000 per month, research allowance of 5,000 to be given in full during the conduct of the thesis research, graduation allowance not exceeding 3,000.00 and matriculation/

tuition/school fees for the period of 2 years

CNSC in its aim to become a premier public higher education institution in the Bicol Region moves forward in the internationalization of its programs, policies and processes. One of the initiatives to realize this aim is the conduct of Academic Forum on Internationalization on August 22, 2017 held at CNSC Pavilion Amphitheatre spearheaded by the head of International Linkages Office, Ms. Maria Angela Josefa G. Pioquinto. A total of 150 administrative officials and faculty attended the event.

Dr. Ruperto S. Sangalang, Adjunct Professor of Cavite State University Graduate School and former chair of the CNSC Board of Trustees served as the resource speaker of the event. He talks about the Internationalization of Philippine Higher Education: Realities

and Prospects. He said that to be an international powerhouse, a certain college or university should possess these characteristics: high citation and reputation scores, performs well in scientific discipline, have large scale multidisciplinary researches, high percentage of students doing PhDs basic research, very strong and highly cited researchers, international research prospects, and hires academics to solve global problems.

In addition, he stressed the importance of recent realities such as intensification of global competition, rise of neo-liberalism, International Assessment of Competitiveness, reputation race, international standards/benchmarking, strong Asian catch-up mentality, collective anxiety in fear of being left behind,

sector-wide reform in higher education to maintain comparative advantages over neighboring countries.

The factors to be considered in internationalization include legal status and financial details of a college/university, status of the premises of the college/university, health and safety issues, staff profile, student's profile, copyright and data protection policies, policies concerning academic progress, policies on student welfare, research activities, marketing policies, selection, admission, tracking and monitoring of students. The current reality for Philippine HEIs is that they are left behind by many ASEAN universities and many SUCs will find difficulties in becoming internationally recognized.

Embracing the realities and prospects for a college gearing towards becoming internationally known, these insights will serve as inspiration and guide of the institution in its pursuit of excellence in education. The dream may seem gigantic and challenging, but the strong commitment and support of the administration, faculty, staff, students and other stakeholders as ONE CNSC: Onwards to Excellence, the internationalization of programs, policies, standards and processes will not be difficult to be realized. **(GD Lamug)**

CNSC Faculty take part in INETCON 2017

With the aim of supporting its faculty in continuously updating and innovating their teaching styles, Camarines Norte State College sent six of its language instructors to a three-day event titled "International English Teachers Conference (INETCON)" on August 18-20, 2017 at Teacher's Camp Baguio City.

Helen D. Cabanilla, Gracia A. De Los Reyes – College of Arts and Sciences, Jocelyn E. Trinidad - College of Business and Public Administration, Menchie I. Bernardo, Eric P. De Leon and Delma Jean V. Abad – College of Education got the opportunity to update themselves on the trends in teaching Oral Proficiency in English as a Second language.

Almost 900 English teachers and 40 students from the Philippines, Malaysia, India and Korea, Japan and China attended the said event. The entire proceedings featured multinationals speakers and facilitators who were all trained at training students and professionals in speaking English fluently and proficiently as they are aided by their American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages

(ACTFL) Speaking Proficiency Guidelines of 2012 - which describe spoken language ability from highly proficient speaker to individual with little or no functional ability in spoken language.

The attendees specifically updated their learning of multifarious theories and practices in teaching English as an additional language. To wit, The Malaysian Teachers Perspective in Code Switching in which it is closely related in the Philippine setting, the present realities in Oral Proficiency teaching which included strategic fluency and discourse competence, and the research oriented results which call for a standard oral proficiency assessment system for Filipinos as stated by the researchers.

INETCon serves as an avenue for intercultural exposure in terms of teaching and learning the International language –English, as best practices in multicultural teaching in communicating effectively addressing various contexts were shared by the speakers and basically those were outputs generated from researches they have conducted in their



To support the college goal of intensifying research undertaking and to provide avenues for faculty and staffs professional development, the College of Agriculture and Natural Resources (CANR) held a Seminar- Workshop on Upgrading Research Instruction held last September 7, 2017 at CNSC CANR Computer Laboratory, Labo, Camarines Norte.

It was participated in by faculty members and staffs of the college.

Dr. Josefina Socorro Tondo, campus

dean welcomed the participants and introduced the resource speaker - Dr. Cesar B. Bermundo, he is a faculty of College of Engineering, an author of several workbooks, developer of sets of software and a recipient of several awards for his works and contributions. During the discussion, he explained the Simplified Statistics for Beginners using its software. Prior to the event, two (2) software were installed in the computer units in the laboratory and respective laptops of the participants. These were

used during the actual workshop.

There was also intensive discussion of Micro Analysis: Test Checker and Item Analyzer with Statistics. During this part, the instructors were taught how to use the software in formulating Table of Specifications (TOS), test questions, and checking the answers.

According to Ms. Jiennefer Tabanao, one of the participants and a statistics instructor, " The event is beneficial for us instructors because we can use the knowledge and the software in doing our researches, and it will facilitate making of TOS and checking of test results. Not only that, our students will also be benefitted as these will be used in instruction and can be utilized in analyzing the data of their research".

At the end of the event, certificates and two (2) of workbooks: (1) Micro Analysis (Test Checker and Item Analyzer with Statistics); and (2) Simplified Statistics for Beginners, both were authored by Dr. Cesar Bermundo, PME and Dr. Alex Bermundo, PME were distributed to each of the participants. **(NC Gange)**

The second day of the event was the continuation of the discussion on graphic seed production and another topic, organic seed banking was discussed by trainers from BPI- Los Baños. The last



exclusively the public and private HEIs in all its relationships, consultations and projects with government. It serves as “the key players in advancing new knowledge for the improvement of academic instruction products with enhancement of job creation and in addressing the key issues confronting the Philippine Society.” Hence, collaboration and complementation in the implementation of the HEIs programs and projects are encouraged particularly in the provision of instruction, research & extension services.

Aligned in this provision, the two-day conference aims to share best practices in instruction, research and extension development, services, and academe industry partnership, to engage in the discourse on strategies and programs that will strengthen and sustain the trifocal function of the HEIs, to establish linkages with other institution, research, extension and sustainability, and to participate actively in a discussion on the Bicol Higher Education roadmap - the proposed universal access to quality tertiary education.

In his opening remarks, Bicol University President and BFHE President, Dr. Arnulfo M. Mascariñas, who admired the volunteerism of CNSC President to host the said event, emphasized the importance of sharing diversities in

research, instruction and development, and keeping abreast with other regions, institutions or countries' best practices. According to him, the present academic climate calls for building and sustaining stronger linkages among existing national and instructional HEIs, thus establishing harmony towards a unified, dynamic goal to harness knowledge and information and to develop methods and practices among HEIs.

Furthermore, CHED Commissioner Hon. J. Prospero E. De Vera III, DPA, in his keynote speech, focused on Quality and Accessible Higher Education Amid Globalization. He emphasized the crucial role played by HEIs in promoting access for all students as stipulated in Republic

Act 7722 or the Higher Education Act of 1994. In pursuance of this mandate, he said that President Rodrigo Duterte approved P 8.3Billion for free-tuition fee in SUCs which is the single biggest investment in higher education in the history of the Philippines. Moreover, he also expounded on the measures CHED is undertaking to strengthen the higher education sector's capacity to provide both access and quality as also a way to head on to international field.

On the other hand, the first day of the regional conference consisted of plenary sessions on Bicol Regional Higher Education Road Map; Dynamics, Implication and Concerns on the Universal Access of Quality Education (Free Tuition Bill); Best Practices on instruction; Best Practices on Research and Development; Best Practices on Extension Services; and Best Practices on Academe – Industry Partnership. It was then followed by the Business Meeting of the Presidents and officers of private and public HEIs which was sealed with the Covenant Signing. The parallel sessions for Research Paper were conducted during the second day.

Hence, CNSC in collaboration with BFHE other HEIs in the region delivered successfully this regional conference which is one step toward the vision of bringing quality higher education.
