President Abanto signs BCAL MOU

CNSC President Dr. Rusty Abanto the Memorandum signed Understanding (MOU) for establishment of the Bicol Consortium of Academic Libraries (BCAL) on January 22, 2018 at the Office of the President Board Room, Camarines Norte State College Main Campus, Daet, Camarines Norte. The event was witnessed by CNSC College Librarian Lea L. Fulgueras, former College Librarian Emma L. Zamudio and other CNSC Library staff.

The MOU among seven private and eight public Higher Education Institutions in the Bicol region aims to establish the BCAL to facilitate cooperation and communication among its members in order to provide greater access and share information resources across all the member libraries; provide support and training for its members; share best practices in providing information services to its users; maintain a database of thesis and dissertation abstracts of Bicol studies; create a union catalog of Bicol collection; and use group purchasing power for licensing of digital resources. All member institutions are understood to be duly equipped with required Board

of Trustees resolutions relative to the establishment and operation of their respective libraries. The consortium also hopes to create an internet gateway to the information and catalogues of its members through a consortium website; creating a training program and share best practices to enhance the services of member institutions; establishing and maintaining a database of Bicol collection; and collectively purchasing of print and/ or electronic resources.

The BCAL MOU is circulating around HEIs in the Bicol region for signature for

the gathering of Presidents and Head Librarians of member institutions is difficult to achieve and too costly to be conducted in one place. It was agreed that said MOU be circulated through mail addressed to the Librarian for signature of their respective Head of Agency and the Librarian of the institution as witness.

The signing of the MOU is a declaration and manifestation of all member institutions collective desire to officially establish the BCAL. *(GA Delos Reyes)*

The janitorial services covered the general cleaning and maintenance of offices, work areas, lobbies, storage rooms, toilets, carpets, furniture, grounds and other areas that may be assigned from time to time. It also includes the provision of standard cleaning equipment, tools, materials and supplies that are necessary for the physical upkeep and maintenance of facilities.

On February 8, 2018, Bids and Awards Committee (BAC) Resolution No. 477 declared CBII Philippines International, Inc. as the bidder with the Lowest Calculated and Responsive Bid for the Supply of Janitorial Services to Camarines Norte State College (CNSC) Main Campus, College of Education (CoEd), Institute of Fisheries and Marine Sciences (IFMS), College of Agriculture and Natural Resources (CANR), College of Trades and Technology

The janitorial services shall be five days a week from Monday to Friday, two shifts, from 5am to 1pm and from 1pm to 9pm and from 7am to 4pm on Sunday. The Contract Agreement for Janitorial Services was between CNSC

ISA is a quality assurance process that assesses the institutional sustainability of a Higher Education Institution (HEI) in five Key Result Areas: governance and management, quality of teaching and learning; quality of professional exposure, research and creative work/innovation; support for students and relations with the community.

ISA aims to help HEIs develop a culture of quality. It is a moral and legal responsibility of every HEIs to provide

quality programs to its students and be efficient and effective through quality systems. Quality programs can be assessed through quality of students and graduates and quality systems can be assessed through tools that show the internal capacity of HEI to translate vision, policy and strategy into quality programs thus, produce quality results. The benefits of ISA to HEIs are continual improvement of the quality management system of the institution, an advantage in relation to vertical typology (SUC Levelling for SUCs) and provide institutions the opportunity for International Exposure Trips.

The coaching workshop covered discussion of CHED Memo No. 46, s. 2012, ISA Framework and ISA Self-Evaluation Documents (SED), accomplishment of

SED thru a Writeshop, comprehensive discussion of the ISA Process and the Role of CHEDRO in the process.
